What Do We Offer?

WRITING I—Good Sentences Build a Paragraph

- write complete sentences with correct punctuation and avoid run-on sentences
- use correct verb tenses and noun/verb agreement
- brainstorm and organize a paragraph to have a beginning, middle and end

WRITING II—The Writing Process

- brainstorm and organize a 5-paragraph essay with a beginning, middle and end
- identify and use adjectives, adverbs and prepositions effectively
- increase vocabulary to make writing more interesting
- practice rewriting a first draft

MATH I—Review Basic Math Skills

- place value and word problems
- fractions and decimals
- computation of angles, perimeters and area

MATH II— Pre-Algebra Skills

- writing algebraic expressions and solving basic algebraic equations
- working with tables
- computing square root, positive and negative numbers

BASIC COMPUTER SKILLS

- understand language of computers
- browse the internet
- set-up and use e-mail
